It was wonderful this week to see all of the children dressed up for World Book Day and we thank you all for the kind book donations for our school library. The children will very much enjoy reading all of their new books. We also had an extremely successful book fair and you helped to raise £600 for new guided reading books for school so once again thank you all for your support. We have an author visiting school on Monday so hopefully the children will come home and tell you all about it!

We would also like to say thank you for all of the positive comments during our Parents' Evenings. We had an excellent turn out and many of you came to say how pleased you were with your child's learning and progress which is fantastic. If you missed your appointment please do approach your child's class teacher and they will endeavour to meet with you at a mutually convenient time.

This week we have also had some questions regarding the Department for Education's draft guidance for Relationships Education which is also known as Relationships and Sex Education (or RSE). The Government have made Relationships Education compulsory in all primary schools from September 2020 and we just wanted to reassure you about the process that we will take at Chad Vale in introducing some of the changes recommended. The draft guidance makes it very clear that the guiding principles of RSE should be that it is age appropriate and be taught both sensitively and inclusively. That the focus in primary school should be on teaching the characteristics of positive and healthy relationships, with particular reference to friendships, family relationships, and relationships with other peers and adults. It also states that RSE curriculum content should 'support the wider work of schools in helping to foster pupil wellbeing and develop resilience and virtues that we know are fundamental to pupils being happy, successful and productive members of society.' As you can see there is nothing there that we don't already teach at Chad Vale in a number of different curriculum areas but in order to ensure we are meeting the guidance at Chad Vale we will be providing staff with some further training over the coming year and we have purchased some new resources to aid teachers in lesson delivery. We will also be working closely with Parents and Governors as part of the process and over the coming months will share our updated RSE policy which will clearly state what will be taught, and when. We will be providing opportunities to attend workshops where you will be given time to look at the resources teachers will be using and discuss curriculum content. This will also enable you to ask any questions and gain further insight into exactly what will be covered. We will also discuss those elements of the curriculum which are compulsory and those which are not so please look out for these on the newsletter! I do hope that this alleviates some of the worries that parents may have regarding how we will teach RSE at Chad Vale but please do come and speak to us directly if you have any further questions or queries.


