## Stage Success for Year 6 Chad Valers: Evita at the Birmingham Hippodrome


We're very proud of Fran, Freya and Hana, who were performing at the Hippodrome last week. Here is a report by Freya:

"Being on stage in Evita has been one of the most amazing experiences of our lives. Hana, Fran and I (Freya) all go to a musical theatre school called SOTE. A few weeks ago, we were chosen to sing and be part of the musical ensemble. After that great news, we were asked to audition for the child solo part, singing Santa Evita. The tapes were sent off and the Director had to choose two girls to sing the solo on different nights throughout the week. I was chosen to do five of the eight performances from opening night on the Tuesday and all of Wednesday and Thursday.

The show Evita is a musical based on the life of a powerful political woman called Eva Peron. During the week, we had to appear onstage throughout the show but my solo was in the 2nd Act. ## Level 2 Games: Handball

Handball always proves to be very popular with our Y6 pupils, so when we were invited to take part in the Shenley Partnership Level 2 Handball Competition we entered two teams; one made up of pupils from 6C the other from 6V.

Our teams were competing against ten others from seven different school. The teams were spilt into two leagues of six teams, with each team playing against the other five in their league. Three points were awarded for a win and one point for a draw. The top two placed teams in each league then progressed into the semi-finals, with the other four teams playing off against the team in the same position in the other league to establish a final position.

The Chad team started brightly drawing their first fixture & winning their second. But after falling to a narrow defeat in their third game they were unable to add any more points to their total following defeats in their fourth & fifth matches. The team then finished in fifth place in their league & played off against Raddlebarn A team to decide who finished in ninth place overall. A late Raddlebarn goal saw them take a 2-1 victory, leaving our Chad team in tenth place overall.

The Vale team improved throughout the competition, drawing their second & final game. This left them in sixth place in their league so they played off against Raddlebarn B team in the eleventh place playoff. Saving their best performance for last, the Vale team kept their first clean sheet of the tournament to secure a 1-0 victory & claim eleventh place overall.
