Introduction



Dear Parents and Carers,

Starting a new school is a special and exciting time for you and your child. You will of course have many questions and this booklet gives you information about Birmingham primary schools and helps you apply for a place for your child. If your child is starting school in September 2014, we would ask you to apply online at the following website www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions – Applying online means that you can find out which school your child has been offered by email on the offer day, rather than waiting for your offer letter to be posted to you. The option of using a paper form is still available if you prefer this method.

Birmingham City Council operates a 'co-ordinated scheme' for primary school admissions which means that families in Birmingham can apply for schools both inside and outside the Birmingham area. If you don't live in Birmingham but want to apply for a Birmingham primary school, you should do this via the application process of your own local authority. Contact details for neighbouring local authorities can be found in Appendix 3.

We are very proud of all of our schools in Birmingham. Whichever school your child attends they will be made very welcome. Achievements in our primary schools continue to improve across the city. All staff in schools and in wider children's services are committed to ensuring that every child is able to be the best they can be.

Schools also have their own prospectuses and websites. I recommend you take the opportunity to read these and also to visit our schools where you will find a lot more information to help you decide which school you would like your child to attend. Last year, 96% of Birmingham children starting in reception class were offered a place at one of their preferred schools and it is our mission to ensure that your child thrives wherever they go.

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Section 1 – Types of schools in Birmingham

There are various types of primary schools in Birmingham. These include maintained schools managed by the local authority or other organisations and academies that are state-funded but independent from local authority control.

In line with legislation, Birmingham City Council co-ordinates applications and offers to all state-funded schools in Birmingham, regardless of the type of school or academy.

However, different types of schools and academies have different admission authorities, and therefore different admission and appeal processes. In particular, academies, foundation, voluntary aided and free schools may have their own oversubscription criteria, and many of them have supplementary information forms that need to be completed in addition to the local authority form. You should carefully read and understand the admission arrangements for these schools before completing your child's application.

Community and voluntary controlled schools

Birmingham City Council is the admission authority for all community and voluntary controlled schools in Birmingham. The local authority ensures that these schools adhere to the published admission arrangements. The local authority also manages the waiting lists and arranges independent appeal hearings on behalf of community schools.

Voluntary aided schools

These are schools that have been set up by voluntary bodies, such as churches or foundations. The governing body at each voluntary aided school is its own admission authority and is responsible for setting the oversubscription criteria at their school, although the local authority co-ordinates the offer of places for reception class.

Foundation schools

The governing body is the admission authority at each foundation school. The governing body is responsible for setting the oversubscription criteria at their school, although the local authority co-ordinates the offer of places for reception class.

Academies

Academies are independent, all-ability, state-funded schools that are either new schools managed by independent bodies or existing schools that have converted to academy status. The Academy Trust at each academy is its own admission authority and is responsible for setting the oversubscription criteria at their academy, although the local authority co-ordinates the offer of places for reception class.

Free schools

Free schools are new independent, state-funded schools that are established by individuals or organizations from a wide range of backgrounds, including charities and community groups. The body that established each free school is its own admission authority and is responsible for setting the oversubscription criteria at their school, although the local authority co-ordinates the offer of places for reception class.

Schools in other local authorities

Birmingham City Council operates a co-ordinated admissions scheme with other admission authorities in Birmingham, as detailed above, and with surrounding local authorities. This means that your preferences can be for schools that are inside and outside of Birmingham. If you apply for schools in another local authority then you should contact that authority for their information booklet. This will help you to decide whether your application is likely to be successful based on their admission policies. However, if you are resident within Birmingham (ie If you pay your Council Tax to Birmingham), for normal admission rounds, ie your child is starting school or transferring from an infant to a junior school, your application must be made to Birmingham City Council even if one or more of your preferred schools is situated within a neighboring local authority's area. For all other year groups you should contact the

relevant authority to establish how they deal with in-year applications. Contact details for surrounding local authorities can be found in Appendix 3.

Oversubscription criteria

Children are admitted to schools in accordance with parental preference as far as possible. However, where there are more applications than there are places available, places at schools will be offered based on the oversubscription criteria for that school.

Oversubscription criteria for community and voluntary controlled schools

1. Looked after or previously looked after children.
2. Siblings (brother or sister who will still be in attendance in September 2014).
3. Denominational claims (in the case of voluntary controlled Church of England primary schools).
4. Distance (children who live nearest the school measured in a straight line).

Children living within the catchment areas of Chilcote Primary, Hall Green Infant and Hall Green Junior Schools will have priority over those living outside these catchment areas.

Oversubscription criteria for academies, voluntary aided, foundation and free schools

Please see individual schools in Section 7. Every effort has been made to ensure that the oversubscription criteria for these types of schools are correct at the time of printing, but it is possible that changes may occur before or after the beginning of September 2014. You are advised to visit www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions to view the most up to date oversubscription criteria for each school.

The following definitions apply to all Birmingham maintained schools (unless otherwise stated in Section 7):

Children with a statement of special educational needs (SEN)

Any child with a statement of special educational needs (SEN) is required to be admitted to the school

that is named in their statement. This gives any such child overall priority for admission to the named school. This is not an oversubscription criterion.

Definition of looked after or previously looked after children

Looked after children or children who were previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, residence or special guardianship order. This includes any child/young person who is subject to a Full Care Order, an interim Care Order, accommodated under Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989, is remanded or detained into local authority accommodation under Criminal Law or who has been placed for adoption. Birmingham City Council's School Admissions and Pupil Placements Service will obtain names of all children who are looked after or were previously looked after, within the appropriate age range, from the Looked After Children Education Service (LACES). Places for these children will be considered in accordance with each school's admission criteria.

Distance – home to school measurements

Distances are calculated on the basis of a straight line measurement between the applicant's home address and the main gate or centre point of the school (unless otherwise stated). Birmingham City Council uses a computerised system called Cartology, which measures all distances in metres. Ordnance Survey supplies the co-ordinates that are used to plot an applicant's home address within this system.

Additional/supplementary information forms

All parents who list their preferred schools on the local authority preference form or online application are regarded as having made valid applications. However, an additional or supplementary information form may also have to be completed for applicants considered under the faith criterion for faith schools (please check individual schools). Failure to complete an additional or supplementary information form may affect the criterion under which your child's application is considered.

Parent/carers and family members

A parent/carer is any person who has parental responsibility for, or is the legal guardian of the child. Where admission arrangements refer to 'parents' attendance at church' it is sufficient for just one parent to attend. 'Family members' include only parent/carers, as defined above, and siblings.

Shared responsibility

Where parents have shared responsibility for a child, and the child lives with both parents for part of the week, the child's main residence will be determined as the address where the child lives for the majority of the week. Parents may be requested to supply documentary evidence to support the address used.

Separating 'final qualifier' applications (eg blocks of flats, etc)

In a very small number of cases it may not be possible to decide between the applications of those pupils who are the final qualifiers for a place, when applying the published admission criteria. For example, this may occur when children in the same year group live at the same address, or if the distance between the home and school is exactly the same, for example, blocks of flats. If there is no other way of separating the application according to the admissions criteria and to admit both, or all of the children, would cause the legal limit to be exceeded, the local authority will use a computerised system to randomly select the child to be offered the final place.

Sibling definition – academy, community, voluntary controlled, voluntary aided (non-Catholic), foundation and free schools

Siblings are children with a brother or sister already at the school who will still be in attendance at the time the sibling enters the school.

Siblings (brothers or sisters) are considered to be those children who live at the same address and either:

- i. Have one or both natural parents in common; or
- ii. Are related by a parent's marriage; or
- iii. Are adopted or fostered by a common parent.

Unrelated children living at the same address, whose parents are living as partners, are also considered to be siblings.

The following definitions generally apply to all Catholic primary schools in Birmingham. Please consult the school admissions policy (Section 7) to check for any specific requirements for admission.

Evidence of Catholic baptism or reception into the Church

In all categories, for a child to be considered as a Catholic, evidence of Catholic baptism or reception into the Church will be required. (For a definition of a baptised Catholic please see overleaf). Those who face difficulties in producing written evidence of baptism should contact their parish priest. Parents making an application for a Catholic child should also complete the school's supplementary information form (SIF). Failure to complete the SIF may affect the criterion the child's name is placed in.

Sibling definition – voluntary aided Catholic schools only

For Catholic and non-Catholic children the definition of a brother or sister is:

- A brother or sister sharing the same parents;
- Half-brother or half-sister, where two children share one common parent;
- Step-brother or step-sister, where two children are related by a parent's marriage;
- Step-brother or step-sister;
- Adopted or fostered children.

The children must be living permanently in the same household.

Distance – home to school measurements

Same as definition for all Birmingham maintained schools.

Parish boundaries – maps

A map of the parish boundary is available at the school and parish, by post on request or on the Archdiocese of Birmingham website <http://www.birminghamdiocese.org.uk/>

Waiting lists

Waiting lists for admission will remain open until 31 December 2013 and will then be discarded. Parents may apply for their child's name to be reinstated until the end of the academic year when the list will be discarded.

Appeals

Parents who wish to appeal against the decision of the governors to refuse their child a place in the school may apply in writing to Chair of Governors. Appeals will be heard by an independent panel.

Repeat applications

Any parent can apply for a place for their child at any time outside the admissions round. Parents do not have the right to a second appeal in respect of the same school for the same academic year unless, in exceptional circumstances, the admission authority has accepted a second application from the appellant because of a significant and material change in the circumstances of the parent, child or school but still refused admission.

Late applications

Late applications will be dealt with according to the local authority co-ordinated scheme.

In-year fair access policy

The governing body of Catholic schools in Birmingham have adopted the local authority fair access policy for admission of previously excluded or hard to place children.

Definition of a baptised Catholic

A 'baptised catholic' is one who:

- Has been baptised into full communion (cf Catechism of the Catholic Church, 837) with the Catholic Church by the Rites of Baptism of one of the various ritual churches in communion with the See of Rome (ie Latin Rite, Byzantine Rite, Coptic, Syriac, etc, cf Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1203). Written evidence* of this baptism can be obtained by recourse to the Baptismal Registers of the church in which the baptism took place (cf Code of Canon Law, 877 and 878).

Or

- Has been validly baptised in a separated ecclesial community and subsequently received into full communion with the Catholic Church by the Right of Reception of Baptised Christians into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church. Written evidence of their baptism and reception into full



communion with the Catholic Church can be obtained by recourse to the Register of Receptions, or in some cases, a sub-section of the Baptismal Registers of the church in which the Rite of Reception took place (cf Rite of Christian Initiation, 399).

Written evidence of baptism

The governing bodies of Catholic schools will require written evidence in the form of a Certificate of Baptism or Certificate of Reception before applications for school places can be considered for categories of 'Baptised Catholics'. A Certificate of Baptism or Reception is to include: the full name, date of birth, date of baptism or reception, and parent(s) name(s). The certificate must also show that it is copied from the records kept by the place of baptism or reception. Those who would have difficulty obtaining written evidence of baptism for a good reason, may still be considered as baptised Catholics but only after they have been referred to their parish priest who, after consulting the Vicar General, will

decide how the question of baptism is to be resolved and how written evidence is to be produced in accordance with the law of the church.

Those who would be considered to have good reason for not obtaining written evidence would include those who cannot contact the place of baptism due to persecution or fear, the destruction of the church and the original records, or where baptism was administered validly but not in the parish church where records are kept.

Governors may request extra supporting evidence when the written documents that are produced do not clarify the fact that a person was baptised or received into the Catholic Church, (ie where the name and address of the church is not on the certificate or where the name of the church does not state whether it is a Catholic Church or not.)

Birmingham City Council will attempt to write to parents/carers of children who are on roll at a community or private nursery advising them of how to apply for a reception class place.

November 2013**

Schools hold open session events.

2 December 2013

Parent/carers should apply online at www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions or return a completed preference form to the School Admissions and Pupil Placements Service by this date.

15 January 2014

This is the final closing date for acceptance of applications or change of preferences through moving address etc. All applications will be acknowledged in writing. If you do not receive an acknowledgement of your application by this date you should contact the Children's Information and Advice Service on 0121 303 1888.

**16 April –
17 April 2014**

Letters notifying applicants of the reception class place offered to their child will be posted on 16 April 2014. Letters will be sent by first class post and **should arrive on 17 April 2014.**

Parent/carers who have submitted their application online will receive email notification of the school place offered on 16 April 2014. Therefore, please note that online applicants will receive email notification one day ahead of postal notifications.

2 May 2014

Deadline date for acceptance of reception class place offers. Parent/carers who have been offered a Birmingham school will be required to return the reply slip to that school. Failure to reply by this date will mean that you are at risk of losing the offer made.

If you have been offered a school in and return the reply slip on your offer letter by this date to the School Admissions and Pupil Placements Service.

2 June 2014

You must complete any appeals forms for community and voluntary controlled schools and return them by this date to the School Admissions and Pupil Placements Service. Some foundation, voluntary aided, free schools and academies may have different appeal procedures. You should contact the school/academy direct or the School Admissions and Pupil Placements Service for further information.

September 2014

School starts. The school your child has been offered will inform you about arrangements for starting reception class.

How to apply online for a place in reception class

Did you know you can complete your Birmingham local authority preference form online?

All applicants who apply online will receive an email confirming which school or academy their child has been offered. This email should arrive by 3.30pm on 16 April 2014, one day ahead of postal notifications.

Benefits of online admissions

- It is a quick, easy, and secure process.
- By using our online facility you will be using a secure and tested system which prevents others from seeing your information.
- It is available 24 hours a day and seven days a week, up until the published final closing date of 15 January 2014.
- Once you have clicked on **'Submit Application Now'** you will receive an immediate confirmation by email that your application has been received.

Before submitting your preferences we strongly recommend that you read this booklet, which you can also view online by visiting:

www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions

This will help you to gain an understanding of:

- The key deadline dates;
- How the admission process works;
- The dates of any school and academy open sessions.

NB: if your preferences include an academy, foundation, voluntary aided, voluntary controlled or free school, then you may need to complete an additional information form, as well as applying online. You should obtain the additional information form from the relevant school or the School Admissions and Pupil Placements Service, and return the completed form to the school by the deadline.

Remember, you do not need to have the internet at home. You can apply online from any computer with internet access – such as from work, in a library or an internet café. Your child's nursery school may also be willing to let you have access to the internet.



IMPORTANT

You only need to fill in one application. Do not fill in both a paper application and an online application.

Please remember to make a note of your user name, password and application reference number, and keep them somewhere safe as you will need these details to view your offer of a school place on 16 April 2014.

When children start school

By law, parents/carers must ensure that their children are receiving suitable full time education from the date upon which they become of compulsory school age, ie from the beginning of the term following their fifth birthday.

In Birmingham your child can go to school in the September after their fourth birthday, and almost all children start school at this time. If your child was born between 1 September 2009 and 31 August 2010, he/she will be able to start school in September 2014.

Deferred entry

Parents/carers may defer their child's admission to school until the beginning of the term following the child's fifth birthday. For example, where a child's fifth birthday falls between 1 September 2014 and 31 December 2014, the parent/carer may defer their child's admission until the beginning of the spring term (ie 6 January 2015). Likewise, where a child's fifth birthday falls between 1 January 2015 and 31 March 2015, the parent/carer may defer their child's admission until the beginning of the summer term (ie 28 April 2015).

In the case of a child whose fifth birthday falls between 1 April 2015 and 31 August 2015, the child can start school at the beginning of the 2014/2015 academic year (September 2014). However, the parent/carer's legal duty to ensure that their child is receiving suitable full-time education does not arise until the beginning of the following academic year (September 2015), when the child will have begun to be of compulsory school age.

It is important that all parents/carers make an application for a school place at the earliest opportunity. If you delay applying until your child has reached compulsory school age, your preferred school may already be full. If you are considering deferring your child's admission to school, you should:

- Discuss this with the head teacher following your offer of a school place.
- Be aware that if your child's fifth birthday falls during the 2014/2015 summer term and you wish to defer your child's admission until the beginning of the 2015/2016 academic year (when he or she will have begun to be of compulsory school age), you will need to make a separate application for a place in Year 1 for that academic year. Any reception class place offered following an application made during the 2014/2015 admission round will be withdrawn if the child does not take up that place during the 2014/2015 academic year.
- Note that, as almost all children in Birmingham start school at the start of the academic year in

which they will reach the age of five, it is likely that some or all of your preferred schools will not have vacancies in Year 1 because these places will have been allocated to children who started school the previous year in the reception class.

Parents' right to apply for a school place

Please do not assume your child will get a place at a school without you having to apply (even if you have an older child already attending). Birmingham City Council will enable parents/carers to express a preference as to where they would like their child to go to primary school, and it is the local authority's duty to carry out parents' wishes as far as possible. However, the law does not give parents a right to 'choose' which school their child will attend and it recognises that it may not always be possible to carry out parents' wishes for a number of reasons:

- Because this would "prejudice the provision of efficient education or the efficient use of resources" because a particular school may be full (ie it has already admitted pupils up to the published admission number for the child's year group).
- Because the school's statutory infant class size limit of 30 has been reached.
- Because the child has been permanently excluded from two or more schools and the most recent of the exclusions took place within the last two years.

Priority for places

You have the right to apply for a place at any school but there is no guarantee that your preferences will be met. This is because there may be too many children applying for the places available. When this happens the school's oversubscription criteria will be used to see who can be offered a place. The children offered a place will be those who best meet the oversubscription criteria.

Attendance at a nursery class

If your child attends a nursery class, this does not mean that he or she will automatically get a place in the school to which the nursery is linked or attached. Parents with children in a nursery class must apply for a reception year place at the school in the same way as any other parents.

Responsibility for submitting preference form

Birmingham City Council, Directorate of Children, Young People and Families will do its best to contact all those who need to submit preference forms. **However, the responsibility for registering a child for the start of the reception year remains solely with the parent/carer.**

Completing the Birmingham local authority preference form

If you live in Birmingham and would like your child to start at any maintained (state) primary school (including those outside of Birmingham) in September 2014, you must fill in the local authority preference form online by visiting **www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions**

If you do not have access to the internet, you may fill in a paper copy of the local authority preference form, which you can obtain from the Children's Information and Advice Service.

If you apply online you will receive an email informing you of the school your child has been offered the day before those who have completed a paper application.

If you live outside Birmingham, but wish to apply for a Birmingham primary school, you must apply to the local authority in which you live (ie the local authority to which you pay your Council Tax) using their online application system or preference form. You can include Birmingham schools on that form and return it to them. Please note that other local authorities may have different admission policies. You should contact them for further information (see Appendix 3 for contact details).

When you complete the Birmingham local authority preference form, we strongly advise you to:

- Complete ALL sections of the preference form.
- Name up to three different schools you would like your child to attend. (If you name the same school more than once, it will only be counted once.

You will not increase your chances of being offered that school and you will waste a preference.)

- Include in your three preferences any schools in other local authorities that you would like your child to attend.
- Rank your three preferences in the order of schools you most prefer. (We will try to offer schools in the order you rank them so put your first choice first even if there is only a slim chance you will be offered that school. Make sure you include at least one school you have a realistic chance of being offered. Your preference ranking will not be shared with schools in Birmingham, but will be provided to other local authorities if you have applied for any school(s) outside Birmingham.)
- Include the full details of any brothers or sisters who will be in attendance in September 2014 at the school(s) you are applying for as this may increase your chances of being offered a place at those schools.
- Include any faith details that are required for particular schools as this may increase your chances of being offered a place at those schools (see individual school oversubscription criteria in Section 7).
- Make a note of your user name, password and application reference number if completing your preference form online. Clearly sign and date the back of the form if completing your preference form on paper. Do not submit your preferences both online and on paper.
- Apply online or return your completed Preference Form to the School Admissions and Pupil Placements Service by 2 December 2013.
- Ensure you receive an acknowledgement that we have received your preferences by 15 January 2014. **If not, please contact the Children's Information and Advice Service urgently as we may not have received your application.**

If your list of preferences includes an academy, voluntary aided, voluntary controlled, foundation or free school, you may need to complete an additional or supplementary information form for that school, as

well as the preference form. (Please refer to Section 7 for schools that also require their own form to be completed.) This additional information form will need to be returned to the school.

Once you have submitted your preferences, you will not be allowed to change them without a genuine reason, for example, if you move house.

If your child has a statement of special educational needs or will have a completed statement by autumn half-term, please refer to Section 6.

If you wish your child to attend an independent (private fee-paying) school, you need to apply directly to that school. If you do not want a place at any maintained primary school please indicate this on the preference form and return it to the School Admissions and Pupil Placements Service so we do not contact you in future about your child's school place.

Only those applications received by the final closing date (15 January 2014) will be considered in time for the offer of places on 16 April 2014.

All applications will be acknowledged in writing when preferences are entered onto the system during December and January. **If you have not received a letter acknowledging your child's preferences by the final closing date of 15 January 2014, you should contact the Children's Information and Advice Service on 0121 303 1888 as we may not have received your form.**

How places are offered

Your preferences for schools in Birmingham will be considered equally, regardless of the order you have ranked them on your preference form.

- If you have applied for any academies, voluntary aided, voluntary controlled, foundation or free schools in Birmingham, the schools will not be informed of the order in which you have ranked

them before the offer of places in April 2014.

- If you have applied for any school(s) outside of Birmingham, the local authority in which the school is situated will be informed of the order in which you ranked their school(s).
- If there are more applications to a Birmingham community or voluntary controlled school than places available, the local authority will apply the oversubscription criteria as outlined in Section 1 to see who can be offered a place. The children offered a place will be those who meet the oversubscription criteria best.
- If your preferences include an academy, voluntary aided, voluntary controlled, foundation or free school in another local authority, then we will send that school or authority your child's details. This is because they are responsible for considering your child's application against others received in accordance with their own admission criteria and published admission arrangements.
- If a school receives more applications than there are places available, the admission authority will use the school's oversubscription criteria to rank applications and return them to School Admissions and Pupil Placements for places to be offered.
- Some of these schools may ask the local authority to rank applications in accordance with their admission criteria on behalf of their admission authority.
- When your applications to individual schools have been considered they will be compared to your preference form by the local authority.

In summary:

- The order in which you rank schools becomes important if you meet the criteria for more than one school.
- The school that you will be offered will be the school where you have met the admission criteria better than other applicants and that is ranked highest on your preference form.
- If your child does not meet the criteria for any of your preferred schools it will not be possible to offer any of your preferences.



Information on individual schools

Head teachers welcome enquiries from parents and will be able to tell you a great deal about their school.

Many schools hold open sessions for parents to attend with their children to have a look around the school and see what they have to offer. If you have access to the internet please visit

www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions for a list of the school open session dates and times. Alternatively the Children's Information and Advice Service will be happy to post a copy of this timetable to you. Local newspapers may also advertise open session details.

Schools also have their own prospectuses or booklets which explain what facilities they have and what they aim to achieve for their pupils. (This information will be correct at the time of publishing but may alter according to changing circumstances during the year.)

What are my chances of getting my child into the school I want?

It is not possible to give guidance which will guarantee your child a place at a particular school. However, if you take the time to consider the following it may reduce the chances of all your preferences being unsuccessful:

Proof of your address

If you live in Birmingham you may receive a letter that has your child's name and address printed on it. It is important that you check this information carefully for any errors. If you find your address is incorrect then you will need to write the correct address on your application and provide proof of address in the form of recent Council Tax documentation.

Admission criteria

Check carefully the admission criteria and any available cut off distances of the schools you are applying for in this booklet or in the other local authorities' information booklets. Be realistic. Would

they have met the criteria in the past three years? If in doubt contact the Children's Information and Advice Service. They will be able to check how far (by straight line measurement) you live from the school(s) you prefer.

Sibling claims

Does your child have any brothers or sisters who already have a place at one of the schools you are applying for and will still be on roll in September 2014? If yes, remember to include their name and date of birth on the preference form. This will increase your chances of getting a place at one of your preferred schools.

Preferences

Do not put down the same preference more than once. If you do we will count this as one application. Similarly, do not put down independent (private) schools on the preference form as these cannot be included. You must apply to these schools directly.

Additional information forms

Do any of your preferred schools require an additional form to be sent in? For Birmingham schools check 'How to apply for Reception Class in September 2014' under the individual school details in Section 7. For schools outside Birmingham you should read the information booklet for that local authority.

Faith claims

If any of your schools require faith details, please remember to include these on your preference form.

Distance

Make sure you choose at least one school where your child is most likely to meet the oversubscription criteria. This is likely to be your nearest school where one of the main oversubscription criteria is distance.

Finally, remember to complete ALL sections of the online application or local authority preference form.

Fraudulent applications

All school places are offered on the basis that the information provided is correct. If a school is offered on the basis of any information that is subsequently found to be incorrect (eg a child's normal permanent

home address) then that place may be withdrawn. Birmingham City Council reserves the right to withdraw any offer of a place on the basis of a fraudulent or intentionally misleading application.

Late applications

Birmingham City Council will only consider applications received after 15 January 2014 (the final closing date) in exceptional circumstances. The local authority will use its discretion when considering the individual circumstances.

For example where:

- There were exceptional reasons which prevented the parent/carer from applying by the closing date.
- A child and the person with parental responsibility have moved into the area after the closing date.

Any applications received after 15 January 2014, without exceptional reason, will only be considered for places after other applications received on time. Such applicants may be less likely to be offered one of their preferred schools.

Once the local authority has exchanged provisional offers with other admitting authorities (March 2014) it will not be able to consider any late application for an oversubscribed school until after the offer of places (16 April 2014).

Late applications received after the offer of places (16 April 2014) until the start of the autumn term will be considered by Birmingham City Council and will only be considered in exceptional circumstances as stated above. Any late application made for a place at an undersubscribed school will be offered.

Late applications made on or after the start of the autumn term should be made directly to the schools concerned.

Change of preference

Once parents/carers have submitted their preferences they will not be allowed to change them without an exceptional change in circumstances, for example, if the family has recently moved address or an older sibling has changed schools. All requests to change preferences should be made in writing to

Julie Newbold, Head of School Admissions and Pupil Placements Service, PO Box 16513, Birmingham B2 2FF.

Any request for a change of preference for a school that is undersubscribed will be accepted and a place offered in accordance with the admission criteria for that school.

When will I know what school my child has been offered?

Birmingham City Council will inform parents/carers of children living in Birmingham which school their child has been offered.

- On 16 April 2014, an email will be sent to those applicants who have applied online, ahead of postal notifications.
- On 16 April 2014, offer letters will be sent to all applicants by first class post, to arrive on 17 April 2014.
- You will receive only one offer. You will not receive letters from schools that cannot offer a place for your child.
- If you have been offered a community or voluntary controlled school, or a school in another local authority, you will need to confirm by 2 May 2014 whether you wish to accept or refuse that offer by completing the reply slip at the bottom of the letter and returning it to the address at the start of this booklet.
- If you have been offered a voluntary aided or foundation school, you will need to return the reply slip to the school concerned.

Failure to reply by 2 May 2014 means that you are at risk of losing the place.

What to do if you are not offered one of your preferred schools

Sometimes, we may not be able to offer you a place at any school you have asked for. This will be because the schools you prefer received more applications than there are places available and children who meet their criteria better than you are

offered those places. If this happens and you live in Birmingham we will offer your child a place at one of the nearest schools with available places at the time we offer places.

If you decide to refuse the place at the school offered it may be that, in the future, we can only offer a school even further away.

At the time places were offered in April 2013, over 96% of parents/carers who applied on time were offered one of their preferred schools. However, there are a small number of cases each year where the school cannot offer a place. If this happens to you, the Admissions and Appeals Service can inform you of other schools that may still have available places. If you feel you would like to pursue the matter further you can have your case heard by an appeal panel that is independent from the local authority. Please refer to Section 5 for further details on the appeals process.

Frequently asked questions

My child attends the nursery class at my preferred school. Will he/she be given priority for admission?

No, attendance at a nursery class does not give a child automatic priority. All parents/carers must apply to their home local authority for their child's reception year place.

If I already have an older child in attendance at my preferred school, do I still have to apply?

Yes. All parents must apply in the same way. It is important that you clearly write the full name and date of birth of any older brothers or sisters that are in attendance at any of your preferred schools as this will increase your chances of being offered a place at those schools.

What if I want to change my order of preferences after I have submitted my application?

Once you have submitted your preferences you will be unable to change them without an exceptional reason, such as a house move.



Can I apply for a place outside Birmingham?

Yes, you can apply for schools inside and outside of Birmingham on your Birmingham City Council application. We strongly recommend that you contact the relevant local authority for their information booklet. This will help you decide whether your application is likely to be successful based on previous years' admissions.

I do not live in Birmingham. Can I apply to send my child to a Birmingham school?

Yes, you are welcome to apply for any Birmingham school. You will need to contact your local authority (the local authority to which you pay your Council Tax) for their preference form. You can include Birmingham schools on that form and return it to them.

What happens if I change my address after the closing date?

We may be unable to take your new address into consideration when offering your child's school place. However, you will still need to inform the School Admissions and Pupil Placements Service and send acceptable proof of your new address to ensure that you receive your offer letter.

Will I need to provide any additional information?

Some schools will require you to complete an additional information form (also known as a supplementary information form). These forms will be available from the school or the Children's Information and Advice Service. You can find which schools these are in Section 7.

Will my application be acknowledged?

All applications will be acknowledged in writing when preferences are entered onto the system between December and January. If you have not received an acknowledgement letter by 15 January 2014, then you should get in touch with the Children's Information and Advice Service.

Will waiting lists be fixed following the offer of places?

Waiting lists are not fixed following the offer of places, they are subject to change. This is because any late applicants will be added to each school's list in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. This means that your child's waiting list position during the year could go up or down.

Can I apply for independent (private) fee-paying schools on the local authority preference form?

No. You will need to contact independent fee-paying schools directly to find out how to apply for a place. Academies are independent non fee-paying schools. You should apply for academies on the local authority preference form.

Section 3 – Year 2 to Year 3 transfer for September 2014

Information for parents/carers of children born between 1 September 2006 and 31 August 2007 transferring from an Infant to junior school in September 2014.

Who needs to apply?

If your child attends an infant school then it is necessary for your child to transfer to a different school for his or her junior education. To request admission to a linked primary school and a linked junior school, all parent/carers are required to complete a 'Transfer from Year 2 to Year 3' local authority application.

In October 2013, parents/carers with a child in Year 2 at an infant school will be sent a letter advising them how to apply online for a Year 3 place at a linked junior

or primary school, or any other junior school in Birmingham for September 2014. A supply of application forms will also be available from infant schools, junior schools and the local authority for those who do not have access to the internet. The same timetable and process as reception class admissions will be used.

If your child currently attends a Birmingham primary school and you would like them to transfer to another primary school you will need to follow the schools In Year application procedures.

Please note if your child attends a primary school then it is not necessary for him or her to transfer to a different school. Your child will automatically transfer to Year 3 at the same school.

Oversubscription criteria for Year 2 to Year 3 transfer – community schools

Where there are more applications than there are places available, places will be offered based on the following order of priority:

1. Looked after or previously looked after children.
2. Linked schools: children who will be attending the linked infant school at the time of application and will still be in attendance at the end of Year 2.
3. Children (siblings) with a brother or sister already at the infant/junior school and who will still be in attendance at the time the sibling enters the school.
4. Children who live nearest the school.

Hall Green Junior – oversubscription criteria for Year 2 to Year 3 transfer

Where there are more applications than there are places available, places will be offered based on the following order of priority:

1. Looked after or previously looked after children.
2. Children attending Hall Green Infant School, ie children who will be attending the school at the time of the application and will still be in attendance at the end of Year 2.
3. Children living within the catchment area of the school who will have a brother or sister in attendance at the school at the time of admission.
4. Children living within the catchment area of the school who live nearest the school.
5. Children living outside the catchment area of the school who will have a brother or sister in attendance at the school at the time of admission.
6. Children living outside the catchment area who live nearest the school.

When will I know what school my child has been offered?

You should apply online or return the completed 'Transfer from Year 2 to Year 3' local authority preference form to the School Admissions and Pupil Placements Service by no later than 15 January 2014.

On 16 April 2014, an email will be sent to those applicants who have applied online, ahead of postal notifications.

The School Admissions and Pupil Placements Service will send out offer letters to all parents/carers who reside in Birmingham by first class post on 16 April 2014 to arrive 17 April 2014.

Parents/carers who have been offered a school in another local authority, will be required to inform the School Admissions and Pupil Placements Service by 2 May 2014 whether or not they are accepting the offer.

Parents who have been offered a Birmingham school will be required to inform the school whether or not they accept the offer by 2 May 2014.

Failure to respond by this date means that you are at risk of losing the offer.



Section 4 – In-year admission – applications for places in other year groups

From September 2013, and for all subsequent years, applications made outside the normal admissions round (in-year admissions) should be made directly to the school(s) concerned. You can apply for a place for your child at any time and to any school. The local authority or the school will provide you with an application form for you to complete when applying for a school place.

Things to consider

Moving to a new primary school is an important step for any child. If you are not moving address and would like to change your child's school, you should take the following into consideration:

- How will your child cope with learning new rules and having to do things differently, or possibly having missed important work?
- If your child has brothers or sisters at the same school, transferring one child may affect the others. Will it be difficult for you to have children attending different schools? How will you manage the start and finish times?
- Many primary schools in Birmingham are full and we may not be able to offer you the school that you want, particularly if the place you want is in reception, Year 1, or Year 2 which are subject to infant class size legislation.

In addition to reading this booklet, we advise that you sit down with your child and ask them why they want to move to a different school. If they mention that they are being bullied or not getting on with other pupils, you should speak to your child's class teacher first in order to try and resolve the situation. All schools in Birmingham have an anti-bullying policy that must be followed. If, after doing this, you still have major concerns or are unhappy about the way the school is dealing with your complaint, you should make an appointment to speak to the head teacher. You may also write to the Chair of Governors.

How schools process your application and what happens next

In determining applications for school places outside the normal admission round, admission authorities must comply with parental preference. In accordance with Section 86 of the School Standards and Framework Act 1998, all maintained schools and academies that have enough places available must offer a place to every child that has applied for one, without condition or the use of any criteria, unless one of the statutory reasons for refusing admission applies.

The statutory reasons for refusal of admission are:

Children who have been permanently excluded twice

If a child has been permanently excluded from two or more schools, while a parent may still express a preference for a school place, the obligation to comply with that preference is removed for a period of two years from the date on which the most recent permanent exclusion took place.

This rule applies whatever the length of the period or periods elapsing between the exclusions and regardless of whether it has applied to that pupil on a previous occasion.

For these purposes, a permanent exclusion takes effect from the first school day the head teacher has told the child not to attend school.

The above provision does not apply to:

- Children with statements of special educational needs;
- Children who were below compulsory school age when permanently excluded;
- Children who were reinstated by an independent appeal panel following a permanent exclusion; and,
- Children who would have been reinstated by an independent appeal panel following a permanent exclusion had it been practicable to do so;
- The admission authority for the school may refuse to admit a child who has been excluded twice, or in the case of a community or voluntary controlled school, the governing body may appeal against the decision of the local authority as the admission authority to admit the child.

Local authorities are still responsible for providing full-time education for these children and may use their powers of direction or provide a place in a pupil referral unit.

Children with challenging behaviour

Admission authorities must not refuse to admit children in or outside the normal admission round on the basis of their behaviour elsewhere, unless the provisions above relating to two permanent exclusions apply.

Admission authorities must also not refuse to admit a child thought to be potentially disruptive, or to exhibit challenging behaviour, on the grounds that the child is first to be assessed for special educational needs.

Where a governing body does not wish to admit a child with challenging behaviour outside the normal admissions round, even though places are available, it must refer the case to the local authority for action under the Fair Access Sharing Protocol. This will normally only be appropriate where the school has a particularly high proportion of children with challenging behaviour or previously excluded children.

If, following admission, a child is found to be seriously and persistently disruptive, the school may consider disciplinary action in the normal way,

including fixed term and, ultimately, permanent exclusion procedures.

In order for co-ordination to be effective, schools that are their own admission authority must communicate the availability of places to School Admissions and Pupil Placements Service when requested.

Fair access sharing protocols

Each local authority must have a fair access sharing protocol agreed with the majority of schools in its area to ensure that – outside the normal admissions round – unplaced children, especially the most vulnerable, are offered a place at a suitable school as quickly as possible. In agreeing a protocol, the local authority must ensure that no school – including those with available places – is asked to take a disproportionate number of children who have been excluded from other schools, or who have challenging behaviour. The protocol must include how the local authority will use provision to ensure that the needs of pupils who are not ready for mainstream schooling are met.

The operation of fair access sharing protocols is outside the arrangements of co-ordination and is triggered when a parent of an eligible child has not secured a school place under in-year admission procedures.

All admission authorities must participate in the fair access sharing protocol in order to ensure that unplaced children are allocated a school place quickly. There is no duty for local authorities or admission authorities to comply with parental preference when allocating places through the fair access sharing protocol.

Where a governing body does not wish to admit a child with challenging behaviour outside the normal admissions round, even though places are available, it must refer the case to the local authority for action under the fair access sharing protocol. This will normally only be appropriate where a school has a particularly high proportion of children with challenging behaviour or previously excluded

children. The use of this provision will depend on local circumstances and must be described in the local authority's fair access sharing protocol. This provision will not apply to a looked after child, a previously looked after child or a child with a statement of special educational needs naming the school in question, as these children must be admitted.

Admission authorities must not refuse to admit a child thought to be potentially disruptive, or likely to exhibit challenging behaviour, on the grounds that the child is first to be assessed for special educational needs.

A fair access sharing protocol must not require a school automatically to take another child with challenging behaviour in the place of a child excluded from the school.

The list of children to be included in a fair access sharing protocol is to be agreed with the majority of schools in the area but must, as a minimum, include

the following children of compulsory school age who have difficulty securing a school place:

- a.** Children from the criminal justice system or pupil referral units who need to be reintegrated into mainstream education;
- b.** Children who have been out of education for two months or more;
- c.** Children of Gypsies, Roma, Travellers, refugees and asylum seekers;
- d.** Children who are homeless;
- e.** Children with unsupportive family backgrounds for whom a place has not been sought;
- f.** Children who are carers; and
- g.** Children with special educational needs, disabilities or medical conditions (but without a statement).

Section 5 – Information relevant to all admissions

Pupils' home addresses

Please note that a pupil's home address is considered to be a residential property that is the child's only or main residence and is either:

- Owned by the child's parent(s), or the person with parental responsibility for the child;
- Leased to or rented by the child's parent(s), or the person with parental responsibility under a lease or written rental agreement of not less than twelve months' duration.

Evidence of ownership or rental agreement may be required, plus proof of permanent residence at the property concerned. If a child is resident with a friend or relative for reasons other than guardianship, the friend's or relative's address will not be considered. Where parents have shared responsibility for a child, and the child lives with both parents for part of the week then the main residence will be determined as the address where the child lives for the majority of the week.

Parents/carers may be requested to supply documentary evidence to support the address used when offering places, such as a copy of your Council Tax bill.

The local authority may undertake a home visit without prior notice to verify a child's home address. If a school is offered on the basis of an address that is subsequently found to be different from a child's normal and permanent home address, then that place is liable to be withdrawn.

If a parent/carer knowingly and willingly provides a false statement, which would affect the success of their application, they may have the place withdrawn.

What if I move house after I have submitted the preference form?

If you move house after you have submitted your application you should contact the School Admissions and Pupil Placements Team Manager in writing or

by email to admissions@birmingham.gov.uk who will advise if the change in circumstances can be considered.

Distance and home to school measurements

The local authority measures from the address point of your home to the centre of the school (unless otherwise stated) using a computerised mapping system called Cartology. Ordnance Survey supplies the co-ordinates that are used to plot an applicant's home address within this system.

Distances are in metres and are calculated on the basis of a straight line measurement. The local authority considers this to be the fairest way to treat all applicants. It does not take into account walking, cycling, or driving routes.

Websites which provide a distance measuring facility do not measure home to school distances as defined by the local authority and therefore will produce different measurements. You should contact the Children's Information and Advice Service if you would like to know the distance from your home to a school.

Waiting lists

Parents whose children have not been offered their preferred school will be informed of their right of appeal and will be added to their preferred school's waiting list.

The local authority will send voluntary aided, foundation schools, academies and free schools their waiting lists following the offer of school places.

Waiting lists will not be fixed following the offer of places. They are subject to change. This means that a child's waiting list position during the year could go up or down. Any late applicants accepted will be added to the school's list in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria.

Inclusion on a school's waiting list does not mean that a place will eventually become available. It may be that all those already offered places accept them, thereby filling all available places.

In line with government legislation, children who are the subject of a direction by a local authority to admit or who are allocated to a school in accordance with a fair access sharing protocol take precedence over those on a waiting list.

Community and voluntary controlled schools

The local authority will maintain the waiting lists for all community and voluntary controlled schools until the end of the 2014/2015 autumn term when schools will administer them in accordance with their In Year procedures.

Academies, voluntary aided, foundation and free schools

Birmingham local authority will send academies, voluntary aided, foundation and free schools their waiting lists to maintain following the offer of school places in April. The local authority may request at any time to see the waiting list at these schools in order to determine that the co-ordinated admissions scheme is operating effectively.

How to appeal

Where you have been refused admission to a school, you have the right to appeal to an independent appeal panel who will take into account your individual circumstances.

The panel will consider the school's case that it cannot admit any more children, weighed against your case that your child really needs to be offered a place at that particular school.

However, infant class sizes have a legal limit of 30. This means that they are limited in the matters they can take into account when considering reception, Year 1 and Year 2 appeals. To uphold such an appeal, an appeal panel must be satisfied that either:

- The child would have been offered a place if the published admission arrangements had been properly implemented;
- The child would have been offered a place if the arrangements had not been contrary to mandatory provisions in the School Admissions Code and the School Standards and Framework Act 1998; and/or
- The decision to refuse admission was not one which a reasonable admission authority would have made in the circumstances of the case.

You can only appeal for schools that you have included as a preference. The appeal panel is completely independent and the decisions they make are legally binding on the local authority, the school and on you.

Parents who have appealed unsuccessfully for a particular school may not seek to appeal for a place at the same school, in the same academic year, unless there can be shown to have been a significant and material change in their circumstances.

Starting reception class – appeals for community and voluntary controlled schools

Appeals in respect of community schools and voluntary controlled schools should be made to the School Admissions and Pupil Placements Service. An appeal form can be obtained by calling 0121 303 1888. The deadline for submitting an appeal for a Birmingham community or voluntary controlled school is 2 June 2014. You should not await the outcome of an appeal for one school before deciding to appeal for another school. Appeals can be made for more than one school at the same time.

Starting reception class – appeals for academies, voluntary aided, foundation and free schools

If you would like to appeal against a decision not to offer your child a place at an academy, voluntary aided, foundation or free school, in most instances you should write to the Chair of the Academy Trust or the Chair of the Governing Body. However, please note that some academies, voluntary aided, foundation and free schools may have different different appeal procedures. Therefore, you should contact them as soon as possible to find out about these.

Section 6 – Services to support you and your child

Out of school clubs (before and after school clubs)

There are increasing numbers of out of school clubs (also known as before and after school clubs) in Birmingham. These clubs offer supervised play and care for school age children for two or three hours after school and sometimes before school starts as well.

Most clubs have to be registered by the Office for Standards in Education (Ofsted) (except those operating on school or crown property). Clubs are normally held in schools, church halls, community centres and nurseries. Some clubs also operate during school holidays. Some clubs also offer facilities and support for homework.

If you require such a facility, please speak to the schools that you are interested in to find out if they have an out of school club or other initiatives in place. Further information is also available from the Family Information Service on 0121 303 1888.

Travelling to School

Before you decide on your school preferences, it is worth considering how your child will get to school. In recent years the number of children who are driven to school has steadily increased. This contributes to traffic congestion and air pollution. Less walking and cycling to school is affecting children's health and independence. Birmingham City Council is committed to encouraging more children to walk or cycle to school, or catch the bus for longer distances.

When deciding how your child travels to school, the following points are important to consider:

- How long will it take for your child to travel to your preferred school? A journey planner, which shows routes, times and distances and the bus services to individual Birmingham schools can be found at: www.schooltravelwise.org.uk

- Research has shown that children who walk to school are fitter, have better developed social skills, are more familiar with their surroundings, have better road sense and arrive at school more relaxed and ready to learn.
- Walking, cycling or using the bus reduces congestion on the roads. In the school holidays, when the roads tend to be much quieter, it is clear how much rush hour traffic is school-run related.
- On average, the "school run" by car per primary school costs families £367 a year in petrol costs and general wear and tear.*
(* Department of Health)

If you are interested in regular walking or cycling to school then please ask your school about the Walk to School Week (WTS) or Bikeability training.

Almost all Birmingham schools now have travel plans, with targets to increase the use of sustainable travel. If you need any further information or advice on sustainable travel choices please contact a school travel adviser on 0121 303 7870/1873 or use the email address below.

Assistance with travelling expenses

If your child goes to a school more than the 'Statutory' walking distance from your home, measured by the shortest available walking route, we may be able to provide your child with a free scholars pass to enable them to use bus and train services to attend school.

You will however have to pay if your child goes to a school more than the statutory distance from your home because that is the school you want, even though your child could have gone to a school within that distance.

Statutory Walking Distances

The statutory distances measured by the shortest available walking routes are:

For children under 8 years: 2 miles

For children and young people aged 8 years or over: 3 Miles

Routes are measured from where the child's address meets the public highway to nearest open gate to the school site using a computerised mapping system. The routes is measured along a route that a child or young person might reasonable be expected to walk to school accompanied where necessary by their parents or carers.

Pupils from Low Income Families

Children from 'low income' families (children who are in receipt of free school meals or whose parents are in receipt of the maximum of working tax credit) may be eligible for free transport assistance as follows:

Primary aged Pupils

Children aged between 8 and 11 years of age from low income families are entitled to free travel assistance where they are attending their nearest qualifying school and that school is more than 2 miles from their home.

Pupils with learning difficulties and/or disabilities

We may pay for the cost of transport assistance if your child has special educational needs, a disability or mobility problem no matter how far away you live from the school. Your child may be provided with a free bus pass or a special vehicle e.g. taxi, minibus, wheelchair accessible vehicle etc, to help them get to school. Other forms of assistance might include access to independent travel training; personal transport budgets; escorted public transport; and the provision of pupil guides

Applications are considered on their own merits.

We will take into account whether your child lives within walking distance and is able to walk, whether they are able to use public transport or whether due

to the nature of their special needs your child requires additional support.

Your child must be attending the nearest available school which meets their needs. If you chose to send them to a school further away from your home then you will have to pay the cost of the transport. Assistance is reviewed as in many cases as pupils become older their needs can change.

A full copy of the transport policy can be obtained from the Education Transport Service at the address stated below.

How to apply for assistance

If you believe that, under the rules described you may be entitled to financial help with transport costs, there is a special form to fill in for this purpose. Application forms for bus passes can be obtained from the school your child attends or from the Education Transport Service. You should only complete this form after you have accepted a place at secondary school and not beforehand.

Please note it may take up to 20 working days after receipt of your application to arrange appropriate transport assistance, and you will be expected to make and pay for your own travel arrangements during this time.

Further details about a special vehicle being provided can be obtained from the school your child attends or the Education Transport Service.

How you can appeal

If you are not entitled to assistance under the rules described you can ask that your application is reviewed. A request for a review should be made within 15 working days of the decision being received by the parents/carers. The appeal should be made in writing on the appropriate form which can be obtained from the Education Transport Service.

School meals

The aim of Birmingham's school meal service is to inspire children to eat healthily by providing exciting nutritious food in a safe caring environment.

Menus are designed to offer choice, take into consideration vegetarian, cultural and religious dietary requirements and meet the Nutritional Standards and Requirements for School Food 2007. The local authority/school must provide a free meal to those pupils whose parents/carers or pupils themselves receive:

- Income Support;
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance;
- Support under part VI of the Immigration & Asylum Act 1999;
- Child Tax Credit;
- The Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit;
- Employment and Support Allowance.

Education Welfare Service

Birmingham's Education Welfare Service promotes the importance of regular school attendance for all children of compulsory school age. In addition, the service provides a wide range of help and advice to both parents and schools concerning attendance and absence from school.

As a parent, or someone with parental responsibility for a child, you are legally responsible to ensure your child receives a suitable full time education and for most children this is by attending school regularly. A child should only ever be absent when s/he is so authorised by the head teacher. Failure to ensure your child's attendance can leave you liable to the authority issuing a penalty notice or taking court action against you.

If you are worried about your child's attendance speak to your child's school and mention this article to them. There are a number of services and teams of specialists who work in partnership with schools to help with problems of attendance, learning, behaviour, and emotional or general development.

The Education Welfare Service is also responsible for issuing work permits to employers who employ school age children and the service issues licences for children involved in entertainment whilst overseeing the appointment and training of chaperones for such children.

Specialist support for children with learning difficulties in mainstream education

We believe that children and young people with learning difficulties should be welcomed and educated in their local mainstream school. This is where the majority of these children are educated. To meet the needs of children and young people in their local community benefits them both academically and socially.

We have teams of specialists who are available to work with teachers in mainstream schools in developing individual programmes of help and support for children experiencing problems. We are supporting all schools in using the Standards for Inclusion. If you as a parent, or the head teacher or a



member of staff in your child's school, feel that your child has special educational needs and may require additional help, talk to the Special Needs Co-ordinator (SENCO) at the school.

The Special Needs Co-ordinator has regular contact with specialist teachers and psychologists who can work with the school to gain a better understanding of your child's learning needs and to develop teaching approaches that will meet them.

Starting reception class in September 2014

Any child with a statement of special educational needs is required to be admitted to the school that is named in their statement. This gives any such child overall priority for admission to the named school but this is not an oversubscription criterion. The Special Educational Needs Assessment and Review Service is responsible for allocating reception class places and

amending statements for children with a statement of special educational needs.

Where only one twin has a statement of special educational needs, and a school is named in their statement, the other twin will be considered under the sibling criteria even though the twin with the statement is not due to start the named school until September 2014.

Holidays during term time

Time out in term time can seriously damage your child's educational progress. Such leave will only be authorised by head teachers in exceptional circumstances. Unauthorised absences will lead to a referral for action by the Authority.

Parents, penalty notices and court

As a parent you are legally responsible to ensure your child receives a suitable full time education and for most children this is by attending school regularly. A child should only ever be absent when s/he is so authorised by the head teacher. Failure to ensure your child's attendance can leave you liable to the authority issuing a penalty notice or taking court action against you. This would never be done without the Education Welfare Service first seeking to work

with you to ensure your child's attendance. If you are worried about your child's attendance speak to your child's school and mention this article to them. There are a number of services and teams of specialists who work in partnership with schools to help with problems of attendance, learning, behaviour, and emotional or general development.

Long-term illness

If your child is suffering with long-term illness they can still be supported by the school and, if needed, teachers from the James Brindley Hospital School. Speak to your school if illness is preventing attendance.

School uniforms

Governing bodies are responsible for deciding whether or not pupils should wear a school uniform. Parents should contact individual schools for details of the uniform policy and any sports kits. Generally school uniforms should be available in high street shops and other retail outlets rather than from one supplier. Schools should offer arrangements so that no family feels unable to apply for admission on account of high

uniform costs and details should be available from individual schools.

Religion/belief

The law requires all schools without a religious character to provide religious education that fulfils the requirements of a locally agreed syllabus. For Birmingham schools this is the Birmingham Agreed Syllabus for Religious Education. Voluntary aided schools with a religious character normally follow a diocesan syllabus or one agreed by the governing body.

Religious education (RE) is intended for all pupils. However, parents have the right to withdraw their child from all parts of RE. This will need careful thought and discussion and parents are encouraged to discuss with head teachers the religious education provision in the school.

All schools are also required to have collective worship for all pupils every day. This will follow a pattern agreed by the governors of the school. Collective worship is intended for all pupils. However parents also have the right to withdraw their child from collective worship.

Contributions to school funds and school trips

There is no charge or cost related to the admission of a child to a school. Many schools operate a school fund to which they ask parents to contribute small sums. Such donations are entirely voluntary. The money collected in this way is used to pay for activities or to buy equipment that is not provided from the school budget.

School trips are an important part of school life and can contribute to the ethos of the school. Schools may ask parents for a voluntary contribution towards the cost of a school trip but may not charge for a trip, which takes place in school hours or is part of the national curriculum. Many schools offer help to those who are unable to afford the cost of school trips. Details are available from individual schools.

Military families

Birmingham City Council understands that families of UK service personnel often have to move at short notice within the UK and from abroad. If we receive an application along with an official letter from the MoD, FCO or GCHQ stating a relocation date, then we will

be able to arrange a school place in advance of the relocation. Please contact the Children's Information and Advice Service on 0121 303 1888 for further advice.

Admission to nursery schools/classes attached to primary schools

Birmingham City Council provides free nursery education for pre-school children through places at primary schools or via separate nursery schools across the city. Children can attend state nurseries in the September following their third birthday. This is normally on a part-time basis, although there are a small number of nurseries that have full time places.

If you are interested in a pre-school place for your child, contact the school/class/nursery/children's centre you are interested in to get more information. You are advised to put your child's name on the waiting list of the nursery you prefer before your child's third birthday. Although this will not in itself give you any priority it will help the nursery plan their future needs. Sometimes it might not be possible for your child to go to the school/class/nursery/children's centre you would prefer because it may be full.

Priority is given in council maintained settings to children with particular educational or social needs, for example: communication problems, emotional difficulties, physical or mental difficulty. Priority is also given to children with an older brother or sister already at the school (or at a linked school on the same or a nearby site) and who will still be in attendance at the time the younger child enters the school. The distance from home to the school will also be used to decide whether or not a place is allocated. Private and voluntary nurseries operate their own admission policies.

All providers of early education manage admissions themselves on an individual basis and not through a centralised system. Please contact your preferred provider for further information on their admissions policy and vacancies. Appendix 4 – Data Protection Policy

Your guide to data protection

The Data Protection Act 1998 gives rights to you, our customers, about how your personal information is obtained and used by Birmingham City Council. The act also places obligations on Birmingham City Council.

This guide informs you of your rights under the Data Protection Act and details how we handle your information.

What information do we hold and how do we obtain it?

Generally, we receive information about you from one or more of the following sources:

- The school your child attends;
- The forms and associated documentation you submit to us;
- Data matching (see below).

For what purpose do we use your information?

We use your information for one of a number of purposes, which are outlined below:

- The information will be used to allocate your child a place at school.
- Section 12 of the Children Act 2004 requires all children's services authorities in England to establish information sharing databases as part of the Every Child Matters agenda and move towards children's trusts arrangements.

Caring for your data

We undertake that we will have in place a level of security appropriate to the nature of the data and the harm that might result from a breach of security. We further undertake that we will:

- Not hold information about you that is excessive in relation to the purpose for which it is processed.
- Keep any information about you accurate and where necessary up to date. To help us to do this, please keep us informed if any of your details change.
- Not keep data processed for any purpose or purposes longer than necessary.

- Process your information in accordance with your rights under the Data Protection Act.

Your rights

You have certain rights under the Data Protection Act in relation to the information we hold about you. These rights are set out below:

Access to personal data: you may request by writing to the address below, details of the information that we hold about you and the purpose(s) for which it is held. We will provide the information in a permanent form, as at the time of the request, subject to any routine processing continuing between that time and the time of response. Your request will be met within 40 days of receiving the request, or, if later, of receipt of any supplementary information needed to establish your relationship with the authority or verify your identity.

You are entitled, by notice in writing to require us to cease (or not to begin) processing personal data on the grounds that it is causing, or is likely to cause substantial damage or distress to you or to another and that damage or distress is, or would be unwarranted.

This does not apply where you have consented to the processing, the processing is necessary for the compliance with a legal obligation, or the processing is necessary to protect your vital interests.

You are entitled, by notice in writing, to require us to stop using information about you for the purposes of direct marketing. Direct marketing means the communication (by whatever means) of any advertising or marketing material, which is directed to you.

You are entitled, by notice in writing, to require us to ensure that no decision taken by or on behalf of us and which significantly affects you is based solely on the automated processing of your information.

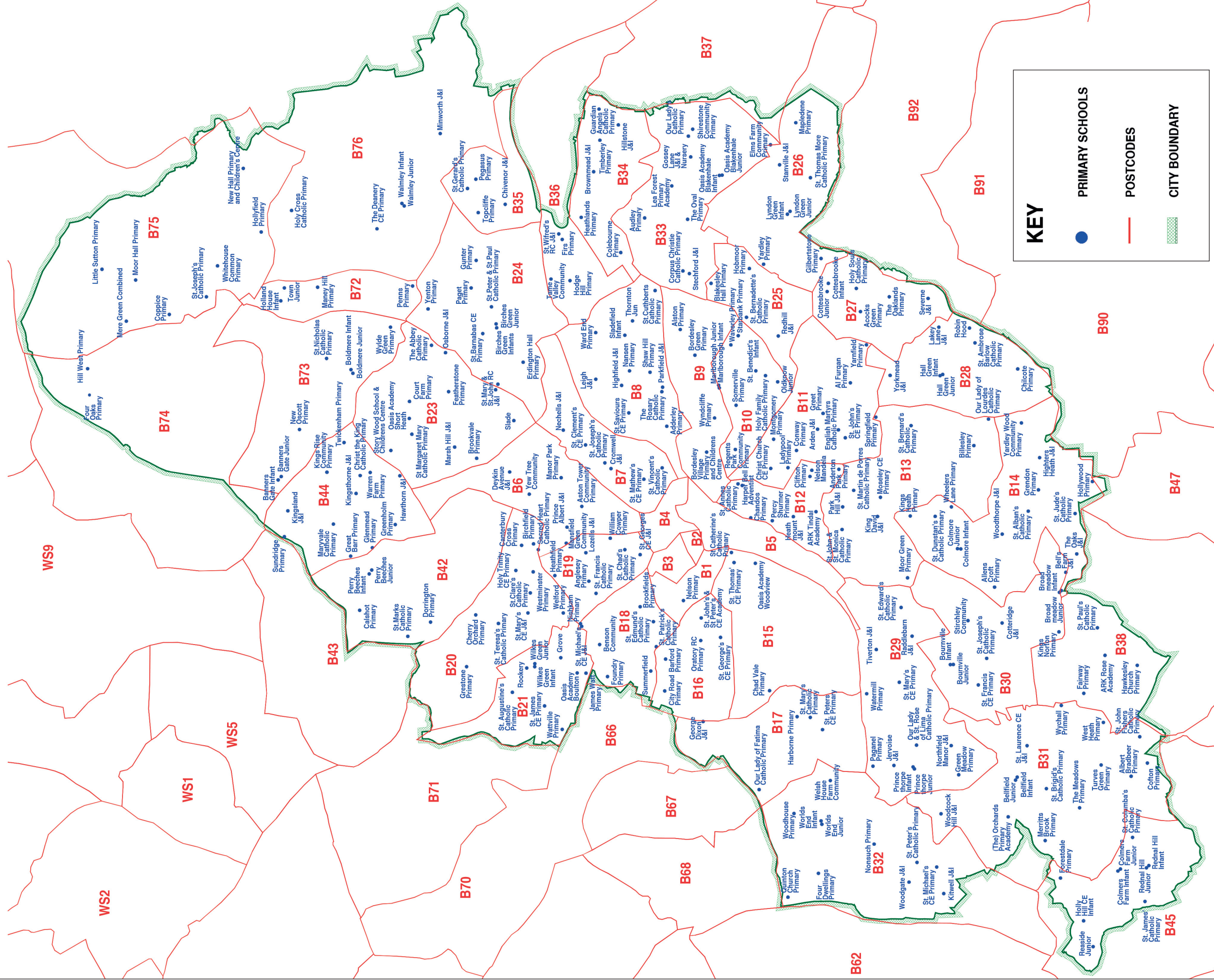
